The final six miles — from the Kanan Road trailhead east to Corral Canyon Road — reopened Thursday after being closed since the fire broke out in early November. "We know that the Backbone Trail is one of the most beloved trail experiences in the Los Angeles area, and we are delighted," David Szymanski, superintendent of Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area, said in a statement announcing the reopening. He noted that this weekend's weather forecast should make it "pretty ideal" for hikers to check out the trail. The portion of the trail that reopened Thursday was particular hard-hit by the fire, which destroyed 120 feet of retaining wall and littered the trail with dangerous limbs. After winter storms complicated recovery efforts, the National Park Service trail crew, California Conservation Corps and Santa Monica Mountains Trails Council worked to make the trail passable, officials said. The reopening comes eight months after the fire and a week after a celebration of the wrap-up of work by
			state-contracted crews to remove ash and debris from private properties affected by the blaze. The multi-agency cleanup cleared the way for many homeowners to start to rebuild.
